

The Astor • 125 Macquarie Street



The Astor was built in 1923, developed by grazier John O'Brien and designed by architects Donald Thomas Esplin and Stuart Mill Mould in an Interwar Free Classical Style. The building was Sydney's tallest for 37 years and the first building in Australia to be owned under Company Title.

The Astor is one of the most tightly held and sought after buildings in Sydney, with its famous classic high ceilings and deep windows. It has been discretely and superbly updated to meet modern day requirements. Despite its façade being refurbished in 2012 its history is still visible from the exterior to its grand foyer to each apartment, exuding an air of sophistication, character and timeless elegance you would expect from a building of its era.

The building is famous for its five-bedroom two storey north- east corner apartment first configured from 3 apartments by Barry Humphries some 30 years ago, with sweeping semi-spiral staircase to the upper level where there is a magnificent master bedroom suite. The Astor provides a lifestyle that cannot be found in any other apartment building in Sydney.
