

Dalby Cattle Sale Market Report

Wednesday 24th May 2023

Ray White Rural Sale Results

The number of cattle penned at Dalby almost doubled from the previous week's to 4,183 head. Export buyers attendance was good with additional support from southern operators as well as the regular feed and trade buyers and restockers. Prices improved for a number of classes. Light weight yearling steers returning to the paddock experienced a small improvement. Light weight yearling steers returning to the paddock made up to 400c to average 372c with poor quality lines at 280c/kg. Yearling steers to feed for the domestic market made up to 406c to average from 342c to 355c and restocker lines in the same weight range also averaged 355c/kg. Heavy weight yearling steers to feed made to 360c with a large number averaging 335c/kg. Light weight yearling heifers returning to the paddock made up to 310c to average 276c/kg. Yearling heifers to feed for the domestic market averaged from 275c/kg to 279c/kg. A small sample of bullocks made to 315c to average 312c/kg. Heavy weight bulls made to 286c/kg. Heavy weight score 3 cows made to 205c to average 195c/kg. Good heavy weight cows made up to a top of 229c to average 218c/kg.
