Terms of a general tenancy

- This part states, under the Residential Tenancies and Rooming (1)Accommodation Act 2008 (the Act), section 55, the standard terms of a general tenancy agreement.
- The Act also imposes duties on, and gives entitlements to, the lessor and tenant that are taken to be included as terms of this agreement.
- The lessor and tenant may agree on other terms of this agreement (special terms),
- A duty or entitlement under the Act overrides a standard term or special term if the term is inconsistent with the duty or entitlement.
- A standard term overrides a special term if they are inconsistent Note - Some breaches of this agreement may also be an offence under the Act, for example, if
 - the lessor or the lessor's agent enters the premises in contravention of the rules of entry under sections 192 to 199; or
 - the tenant does not sign and return the condition report to the lessor or the lessor's agent under section 65.

More than 1 lessor or tenant
